- III. Update on sale of Frontier High School Property: Built in 1920, a little over 100 years ago. This building housed the districts alternative high school and preschool until 2020. The most recent contract fell through approx. 2 weeks ago. What are our next steps? The district is looking at partnering with organizations, selling, or changing the zoning on the property. It is zoned as institutional; buyers would have to go through a re-zoning process. It has historical meaning to it; however it is not a historical landmark. The preference is to still sell, but they are still trying to make that area meaningful to the community. The district does lose approx. \$60,000 \$65,000 a year to keep it on the market, for heat, water, electric.
- IV. School Performance Frameworks: The "report card" for schools, 60% on CMAS, Academic Growth (how much growth would it take for you to stay on that level), and Academic Achievement (how high did you score). High school also gets graded on graduation rates, as well as how many students go on to a

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college. The school performance framework is labeled by CDE, there are four different rates, turnaround, priority improvement, Improvement, performance.
