# 4.0 EDUCATION SHOWCASE

4.1 Singing Hills Elementary Showcase

Singing Hills Elementary Principal Regina Montera presented highlights from the school to the Board of Education.

The mission at Singing Hills Elementary and Preschool is to collaboratively help all children reach their highest potential and become productive members of society. Success for all students!

Singing Hills implemented new curriculum this year for language arts (Core Knowledge Language Arts) and an updated math curriculum (Everyday Mathematics). Both Singing Hills and Running Creek Elementary are using the same curriculum so all Elizabeth Schools students will begin 6<sup>th</sup> grade at Elizabeth Middle School with a common curricular foundation in math and language arts.

Singing Hills added 15 new individuals to its staff this year in new positions or to fill vacancies.

SHE holds a number of community events throughout the year, including:

- Back-to-school night
- Monster Mash Halloween celebration put on by PTCO
- Student Support raised money to send a SHE student on Make a Wish trip
- Veteran's Day Celebration
- Holiday program and door decorating contest
- · Added a preschool family movie night this year
- Kindergarten open house and preschool open house
- Volunteer appreciation at end of school year



Singing Hills has an active parent community with its PTCO, School Accountability Committee (SAC), Room Parents, Watch D.O.G.S. (Dads of Great Students) and parent/community volunteers. Helping Hands is new this year and involves parents coming in every other Thursday to help teachers make copies, cut, collate, etc. Helping Hands provides a great opportunity for parents, particularly parents who are new to the school, to get to know school staff and other parents. Helping Hands originated as a recommendation from the school's SAC.

The school continues to focus on building the SHE Family and meeting the needs of the individual child. This is accomplished a number of different ways, including:

- I Believe statements This year every staff member wrote down what they believe about kids and education. The statements are inspirational and they're posted throughout the school.
- Classroom morning meetings At the start of each day, students and teachers gather together and interact with one another to share important events in their lives. It's an engaging way to start the day, it builds a sense of community and helps students get ready to focus and learn.
- Fostering Resilient Learners book study Staff are participating in the book study and learning about the emotional development of students and how they can better support them.
- **Problem Solving Team** Kindergarten through 5<sup>th</sup>-grade teachers, and specials teachers, have the opportunity to share what they're struggling with in the classroom, what they've tried and get support and suggestions from their peers.
- Collaborative Thursday On Thursday morning's staff discuss individual student needs and discuss student data and results.

This is the second year of the three-year SiMR (State Identified Measurable Result) literacy project funded by the Colorado Department of Education's Exceptional Student Services Unit. This year, kindergarten through second-grade teachers, along with special education and Title teachers, receive professional development training and a coach two days a week. As part of SiMR, students are taught a 30-minute phonics routine and the results have been very encouraging.

SHE provides a number of activities for students, including:

- Ambassadors 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade
- Student Advisory Council 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade
- Choir 3-5<sup>th</sup> grade
- Art Club 5<sup>th</sup> grade
- Book Club 3-5<sup>th</sup> with 5<sup>th</sup> grade sleepover
- Good News Club
- Robotics Club 5<sup>th</sup> grade
- Taekwondo after school K-5 program
- Pom & Dance Clinic after school K-5 program
- Thursday Morning Clubs K-5<sup>th</sup> grade

More than 100 students participate in the morning activities SHE offers on Thursday late-start days.

# 4.2 EHS State Gymnastics Recognition

The Board of Education recognized and visited with the Elizabeth High School 4A state gymnastics champions. The 24 team members and two coaches shared how determination, perseverance and teamwork helped them come from behind and earn the state title by three points.

Coach Stacey Folmar said she could not be more proud of the team. The Board of Education praised the team for their hard work and accomplishment. Director Benkendorf said the gymnastics team has set the standard for athletics in Elizabeth.



Elizabeth High School is the third smallest school in Colorado to offer a gymnastics program.
