7.0 COMMUNICATION

7.1 HR Update

HR Director Kin Shuman gave an update on hiring. The district is currently recruiting for a part-time administrative specialist for the superintendent's office and a science teacher at Elizabeth High School.

The district had a great start the school year in terms of few employee injuries or workers comp claims.

Shuman share that the district is trying something new. All employees get along very well, but we have one issue right now and bringing in a mediator. The process will take one day bring in the principal and each employee separately and then both together to help them.

7.2 Technology Update

Technology Director Marty Silva shared an update on the two-day Internet outage the district recently experienced due to a fiber optic line that was cut by construction workers off of Stroh and Parker Roads. Over the past several years, the district has added 500 computers in classrooms and there's become a greater reliance on the Internet. Silva is initiating conversations within the district about the possibility of having two Internet providers, similar to many larger districts. However, because Elizabeth Schools is in a rural area, there aren't many options for backup providers that have fiber optic lines that the district can be tied into. Right now the district is paying about \$2,000 monthly for gig connection. It would probably be an additional \$1,000 to \$1,500 per month for a back-up provider, if it is feasible.

7.3 Financial Update

In addition to typical monthly expenditures, Chief Financial Director Ron Patera shared that in August there were payments for chimney and brick repair at Frontier High School, the Elizabeth High School roof project, HVAC repairs, the new district and school websites, fire alarm testing, installation of magnetic door holders, rodeo stock contractor services and instructional materials.

Some cost centers are over the 16.67 percent benchmark as of August month-end, mostly due to large, one-time expenditures or expenses that are payable and will be reflected in last year's financial statements. There were some unexpected expenses due to more students in need of specialized services, which will increase the general fund budget by at least \$50 thousand to \$60 thousand.

On Wednesday, Oct. 4, a state inspector from the Colorado Department of Public Safety was on site to perform the final inspection of the Elizabeth High School roof. After a thorough inspection, the district



received a Certificate of Completion. The inspector made a couple of recommendations, which the roofer has addressed, but they also noted that it was a "well-installed roof assembly."

While the district was awarded \$1.15 million in BEST grand funding for this project, due to the diligent oversight of staff and the district's consultant, the district will not need to access all of those funds. The EHS roof project came in at least \$100 thousand under budget. The Singing Hills Elementary roof project also came in 18.23 percent under budget.

Both the EHS and SHE roofs are top-of-the-line, 30-year roofs. The district went from 10-year roofs with a 45 mil thickness to 30-year roofs with a 330 mil thickness. These two roofs are now more than seven times thicker than the roofs they replaced. This is a demonstration of the commitment of the district's governing body and staff to safeguard the students, staff and the capital assets these roofs protect.

A contractor for the Singing Hills Elementary wastewater system has already been selected and the district is preparing a contract for the board to approve at the November 14 meeting.

A new wastewater treatment system is necessary due to the age of the current system and the state's increased standards for nitrates. The level of nitrates coming onto the Singing Hills property from surrounding properties was already above the state's more stringent requirements. For a good year the district dealt with the question of why is it the district's responsibility to treat nitrates that originate offsite and are coming onsite. Ultimately, the district requested a waiver from the state for treating the nitrates. The waiver was granted this summer and the accommodation that was arrived at is that the state will test water as it comes out of the system. Work on the wastewater treatment system project will begin in late spring of 2018.

Once all of the projects are complete, the district will have two top-of-the-line roofs and a state-of-the-art wastewater treatment system. The total budgeted cost of the projects is \$3,148,978, of which \$1,747,303.80 – or 55 percent of the cost of these projects – was funded from BEST monies that were awarded to the district due to hard work of staff in preparing the grant applications. Put another way, the district will not have to spend down another \$1.7 million out of its savings.

Another positive outcome of the BEST grant funding is that since the district will spend down less of its fund balance, more than likely the district will maintain the Aa3 credit rating it earned from Moody's for sound financial performance.

7.4 Superintendent Update

Superintendent Bissonette gave an update on the Teacher Advisory Committee (TAC). The first meeting of the year is October 19. The committee chair from last year took a job in another district, so the committee is looking for a new chair. TAC is the mechanism for teacher and administrators to be in regular dialogue. The group is very important because, since this district doesn't have a union, it's a mechanism for open and regular collaboration. Things have come out of TAC that have made a big difference to the district, such as extended orientation for new teachers and time on their own to plan. Through the committee, alterations were made to the leave policy so that other than sick and personal there is now discretionary leave time which provides more flexibility for staff. The TAC has worked really well and supported staff very well. The committee also provides administration the opportunity to help teaching staff understand the district's perspective. The ability for the group to continue to be a strong force in the district is a priority.
