Grant Application Title: SFY 2019 School Security Disbursement Program Application

- **Scope:**
 - Security oriented grant, tailored toward *securing* facilities and transportation from unauthorized access, transportation of undesirable objects or substances.
- **Timeline:**
 - December 5 – Grant application/info released to school districts
 - December 13 – Grant application work began
 - January 5 - Submitted
 - January 13 - Notification of funding recommendations
 - January 20 - Requests for reconsiderations
 - January 25 – Final notification of funding selection
 - March 1 – Grant agreement emailed to recipient
 - ASAP thereafter – Disbursement of grant funds
- Five projects/categories of security items applied for:
 1. Two way radios/transceiver system for campuses & administration
 2. Campus cameras & emergency notification
 3. School bus cameras
 4. Cell phone boosters
 5. Window ballistic film
- District requested \$103,392 with a district match of \$51,717 across five projects at various matching percentages per project. Total grant application amount equates to \$155,109. Matching percentages from the district varied per project from 25% to 40% with the potential to amend based on recommendations.
