#### 7.2 Chief Financial Report

Ron Patera, Chief Financial Officer presented the proposed budget for the school year 2014-2015. The Board of Education has a difficult job, recognizing the declining enrollment and modest revenue increases, while striving to meet the everincreasing demands for student achievement. During the budgeting process the BOE stressed their desire to continue educational excellence, develop a financially responsible plan and to put students at the heart of everything we do.

Ron Patera coordinated with the district-wide leadership to address the budget challenges. Salaries were increased for some employees who have experienced multiple years of pay freezes. Certified staffing levels were adjusted based on changes in enrollment. Staff support positions were further reduced due to the state's reduced funding from prior years' and three years of fund balance usage to balance the general fund budget. Funds were allocated within the capital budget to improve health and safety at the schools. The district budget for 2014-2015 reduces expenditures by \$504,000 and the impact will be felt throughout the organization. Our revenues have been below 2008 funding levels. Ron Patera indicated that the current business model is unsustainable and that within a few years our reserves will be exhausted. The district administration and its staff continue to be dedicated to providing an excellent education experience for our students.

#### 11.0 DISCUSSION ITEMS

11.1 Bond/Mill Levy Override

Community leaders, the Board of Education, and District Administration are actively working together to consider going to voters to approve a mill levy override, a bond request or both. Our facilities need repairs and improvements, our students and staff needs additional technology resources and support, and we need to attract and retain the very best educators. Approximately 24 percent of the Elizabeth School District's teaching staff leaves each year, primarily for higher paying jobs in other districts. The district is in the bottom 5 percent of per pupil funding statewide when mill levy overrides are considered. The district has great needs and putting off a request for increased taxpayer funding is undesirable.

A professional polling firm was used to survey 100 households for the board of education in understanding what the community values in terms of Elizabeth Schools and the voters' receptivity to a question on the ballot this November. When read a number of needs that could be funded through ballot measures, attracting and retaining quality teachers, providing updated textbooks, as well as providing technology necessary for students to gain skills they will need in the modern workplace were the residents' top priorities. The backlog of needed repairs that this funding would address is a strong ancillary rationale.
