

STUDENT AND PARENT REMOTE LEARNING EXPECTATIONS

Purpose:

Remote learning (learning at home) provides an alternative way for students to access instruction, participate in discussions, share content, and receive homework when in-person instruction is not possible. This document outlines guidelines to be used by students when participating in synchronous, real-time remote learning through an internet enabled computer. Please take a moment to familiarize yourself and your student with these responsibilities.

Student Responsibilities

Students are expected to:

- 1. Attend all live classes and "meetings" on time, as required by the teacher.
 - i. Participate in the remote class similar to in-person learning.
 - ii. Silence/mute the microphone upon entering the meeting.
 - iii. All conversations in the chat field should be school related and use classroom appropriate language.
 - iv. When class/session is over, disconnect and leave the meeting.
 - v. Camera should be positioned to avoid distractions and movement behind the student.
 - vi. School appropriate attire should be worn at all times.
 - vii. Do not present from the student screen without a teacher's permission.
- 2. Complete assignments with integrity and academic honesty, doing your best work.
- 3. Follow all district and school policies, rules, and expectations. These policies include: JS, Student Use of the Internet and Electronic Communications

Parent/Guardian Responsibilities:

Parents/Guardians are expected to:

- 1. Ensure your student safely engages in remote learning classes in accordance with the district and school's policies.
- 2. Create an environment conducive to remote learning.
- 3. As necessary, help your child access learning assignments and attend live sessions.
- 4. Inform teachers of absences for any reason including illness, technical difficulties, or hardship.

- 5. Ensure all members of your household respect the work of peers and adults participating in the district's synchronous, remote learning, as you would visiting the actual classroom, including compliance with district policy KI, Visitors to Schools. This means ensuring that you and members of your household act in a manner that is not disruptive to the learning environment.
- 6. Avoid compromises to the privacy, safety or security of the staff and students participating in group activities involving live participation, such as video or conference calls.
- 7. Remember that recording or photographing of any students or teachers during remote learning without permission is prohibited.
- 8. Communicate to your child's Principal any concerns related to online instructional opportunities.

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
