Youth ages 14 through 20 discover career opportunities through various business partners in real world settings.



Varsity Scouts

This athletic program is a part of the BSA for active young men ages 14 through 17 The unit is a team; the unit leader is a Coach.



Cub Scouts

This family oriented program is designed specifically to address the needs of boys from first grade through fifth grade.



Venturing

This coed program enables youth ages 13 and graduated from eighth grade through age 20 to pursue shared hobbies, vocational interests and leadership experiences.



Boy Scouts

This outdoor oriented program, which promotes character development and citizenship training, is for boys from fifth grade through age 17.



Sea Scouts

This segment of the Venturing program develops members' boating skills and promotes knowledge of maritime heritage.
